Advent Candle Symbol: weigh scales

Second Candle: Justice and the End of Oppression

One blue/purple candle is lit.

In the name of the One who came to bring justice, we gather around the Advent wreath.

The prophet Isaiah announces, "Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations" (Isaiah 42:1).

A tiny babe, a child of wisdom, an adult with courage, Jesus lived the way of justice. He committed to a ministry of ending oppression. Jesus the Christ brought hope for troubled folk.

"What does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk\* humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8).

We too travel the paths of justice, kindness, and humility, knowing that these are the footprints\*\* of the merciful Christ.

This Advent season we commit ourselves to Isaiah's instruction: "Learn to do good; seek justice; rescue the oppressed; defend the orphan; plead for the widow" (Isaiah 1:17).

We light the second Advent candle committing ourselves to the way of justice and overcoming oppression. We place on the communion table these scales, reminding ourselves of the scales of justice. The second candle is lit

VU 6 v. 2 A candle is burning a candle of peace, a candle to signal that conflict must cease: for Jesus is coming to show us the way; a message of peace humbly laid in the hay.
