Ministry and Personnel – They have not met since the last meeting so there is nothing new to report.

Meridian Interchurch-

The Inter-Church council met the morning of November 18 at LaSalle Fellowship Church.

The Meridian Inter-Church Advent Service will be held Sunday November 30 at Springstein Mennonite Church at 7pm. All are welcome. There is a joint choir with our 3 United Churches (Avonlea, Sanford and Starbuck) which will perform 'Advent Candlelight Carol'.

We have been asked to bring 3 dozen dainties/baked goods.

The Meridian Inter-Church group estimates that 2026 may be the 55th anniversary of the Council. One idea to celebrate the anniversary is to have a dinner and invite all the people of our congregations involved in leadership roles: those on boards, councils, committee's etc. As well as past pastors/ministers. A possible date would be in April 2026. Think about if this is something you'd be interested to participate in.

Prairie to Pine – Prairie to Pine Regional Meeting

The Region met virtually on November 13. Here are some highlights:

1) A newer position in the Region is the 'Growth Animator'. Led by Jordan Cantwel.

Sort of an 'all purpose' support provided by the Region, the Growth Animator has discussed everything from reimagining use of church buildings, to planting churches for underserved populations, to building community partnerships. Two of the most common topics communities of faith explore with them are discerning God's purpose and vision for their ministry, and developing collaborative relationships with neighbouring churches.

Sustainability of ministry is another key concern for both urban and rural churches. We all know that society has changed, and those changes have had major impacts on churches. The Growth Department was created to support communities of faith as they seek to adapt to these new realities.

2) St. Andrew's College is launching the Oliver & Gruchy Learning Centre. A new initiative aimed at fostering critical thinking, community engagement and a commitment to justice. Named after Dr. Edmund Oliver the first Principal at St. Andrews and Dr. Gruchy, the first woman ordained to Ministry in the United Church of Canada. The learning centre will create a student-centred learning environment that encourages explorations in theological studies, social justice

and leadership. It will also serve as a hub for learners to explore ongoing educational opportunities.

3) **Towards 2035**, a presentation by Rev. Cameron Fraser, out of the General Council Office, Director of Growth and Ministry Development. He works out of Regina, SK.

The presentation was very interesting. The meeting is now on YouTube. Here is the link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TD9yVao6QWk

Cameron's presentation begins at around 14:00 and goes till 46:00. It is about a Resource that will soon be available for congregations to use to have discussions about their vision for the future. Here is an excerpt:

The vision of Towards 2035 is about envisioning the future presence of the church. While it names and understands the declines we're seeing in the United Church and Churches in general, the vision is not about bemoaning decline. It's about remembering Church Union was a vision for a church for Canada that was still defining itself; what it meant to be a church that Canada needed as best as they could name it. And it leaves us the question, what is our vision now? What is the church that we understand Canada to need in 2035 and beyond? And how must we shape ourselves? And what does faithfulness look like now? Not for the survival of an institution, but for the sake of the good news that we are not alone, that we live in God's world.

And this question of what comes next brought together national staff leaders and regional council executive ministers in the fall of 2024 to look honestly at where we find ourselves collectively and where we might be heading. They came together with love for the church and asked big hard questions like what is the likely future of the United Church of Canada if the current path continues? What might it take to shift this trajectory? And what does leadership look like when it comes from a place of faith and not a place of fear? It was becoming increasingly clear that a whole church response was necessary to begin a conversation towards a whole church strategy rooted in a sense of call but informed by our reality and the realities in the church and beyond. And that was fueled by a vision of a resilient, inspired, diverse, and multigenerational church that is called in love to witness and to minister across a vast country and in rural and remote communities and in urban centers in coast to coast.

To be whole church means that each part each part in its own context is asking the same question in harmony with each other. What is the church that is needed in this moment and in the years to come? and how can we best be what our neighbors and our neighborhoods need us to be giving the realities we're experiencing. Towards 2035 is rooted in a conviction that God is present and active in our time and in our places. Towards 2035 asks us to pay attention and to perceive what God is doing and to discern how we will respond. The final stages of being edited and will be available within a few weeks and that will be a tool that will allow conversations to happen wherever you find yourself.
